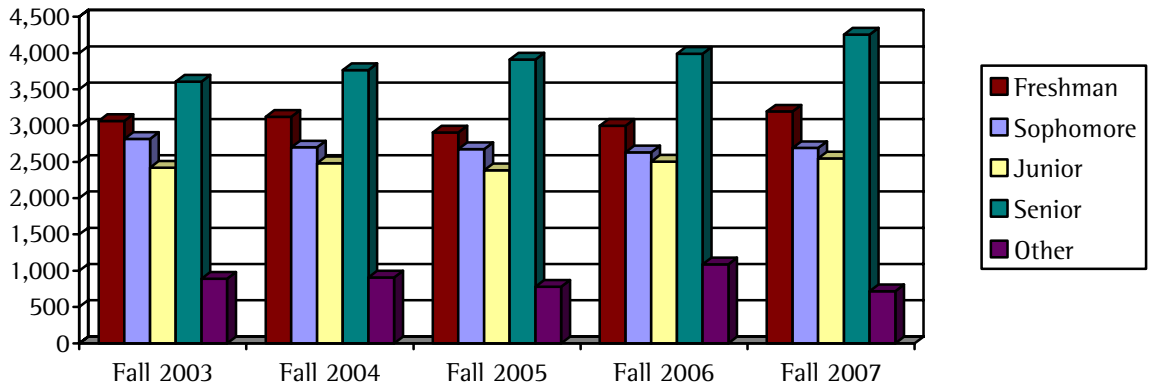

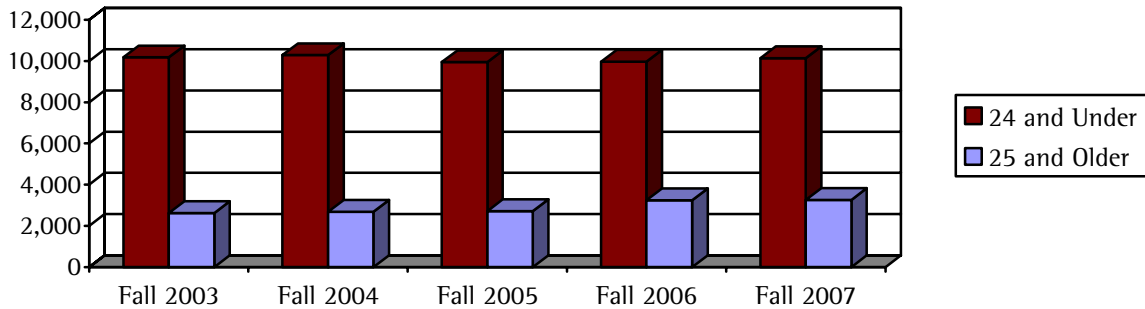

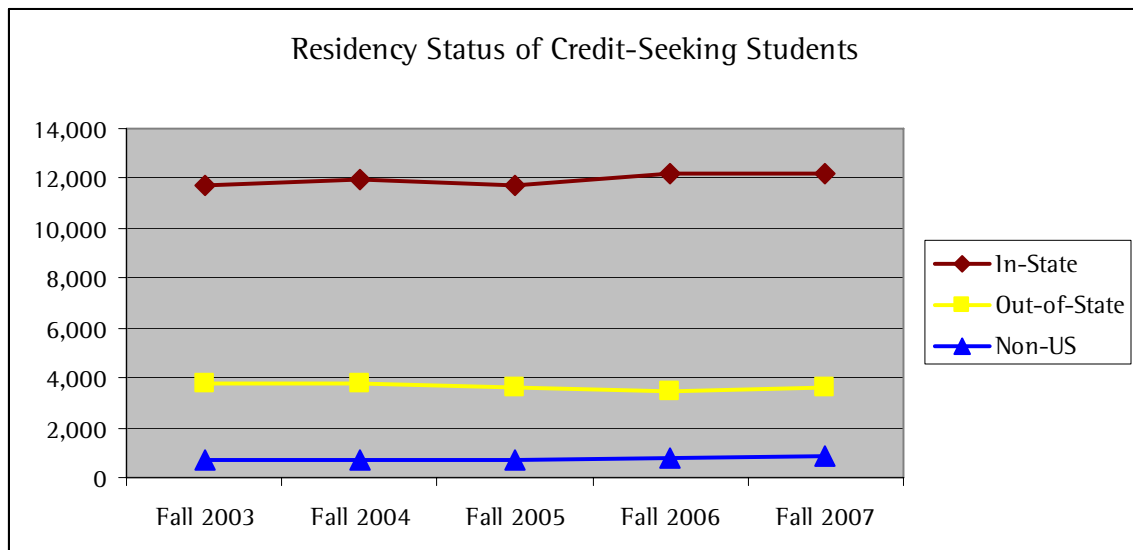

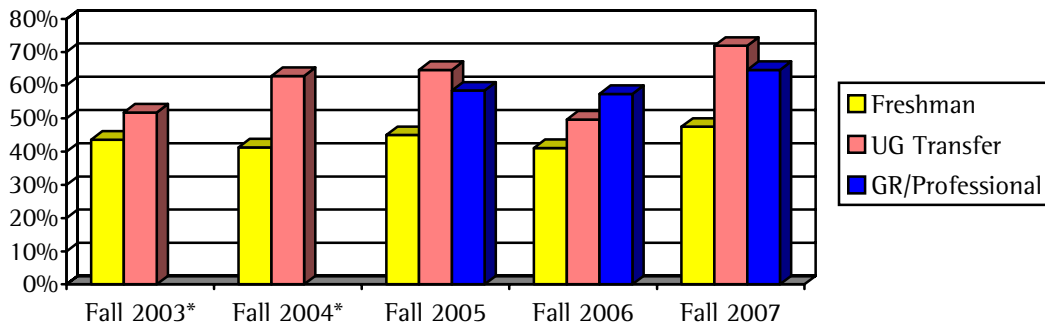

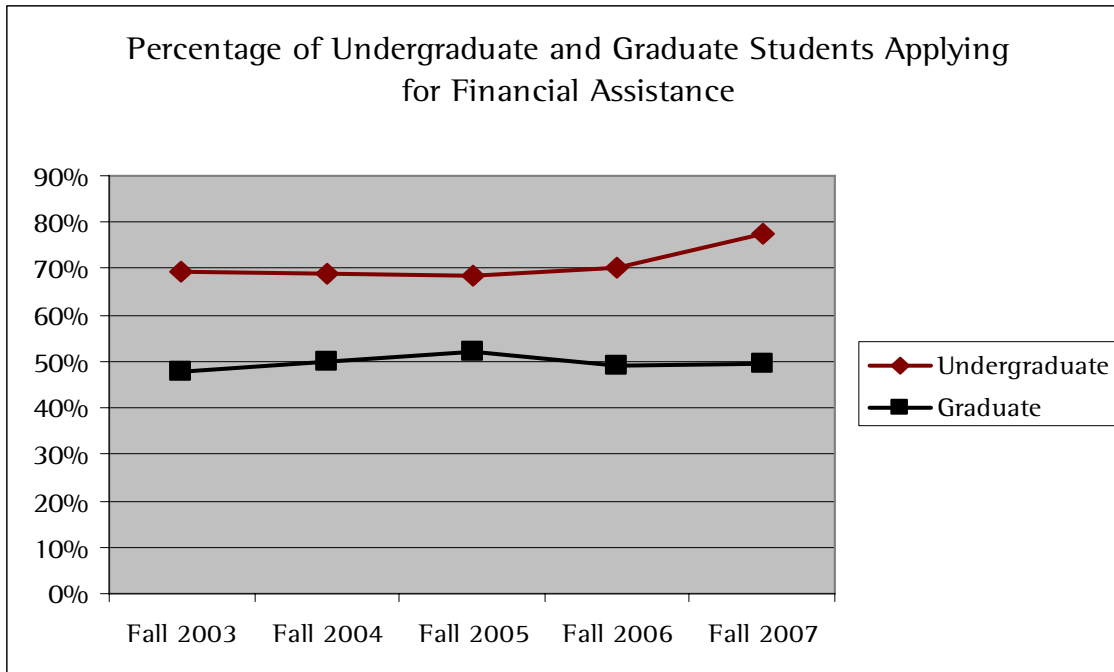

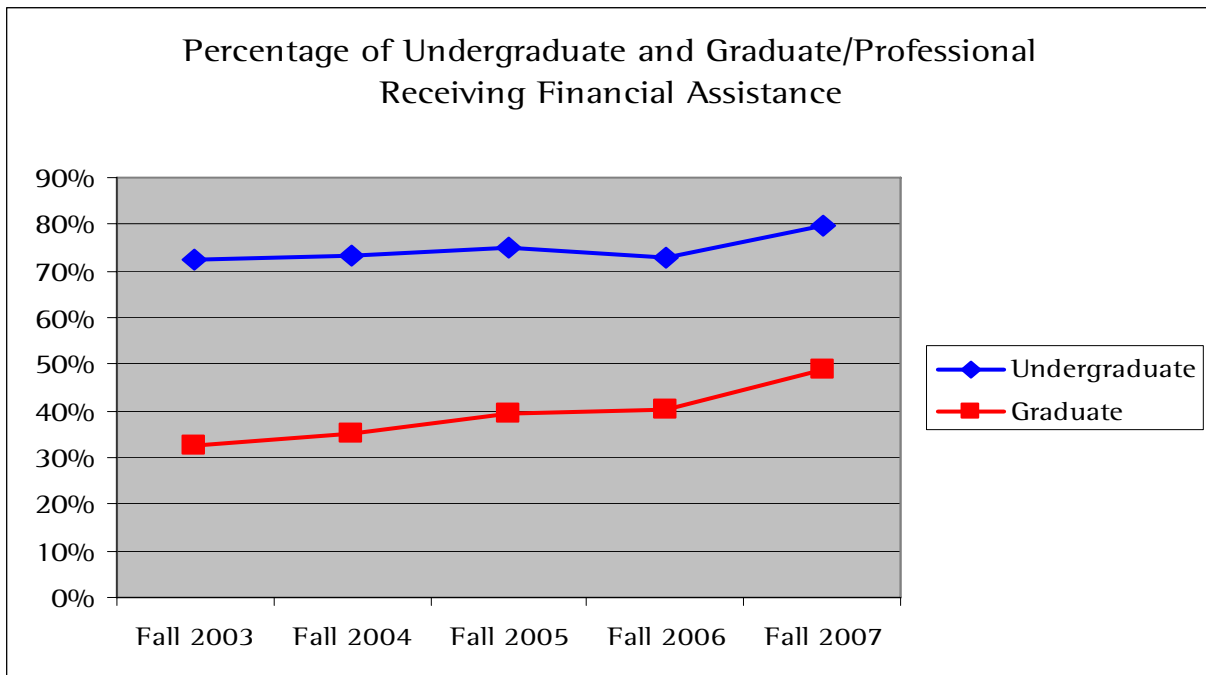

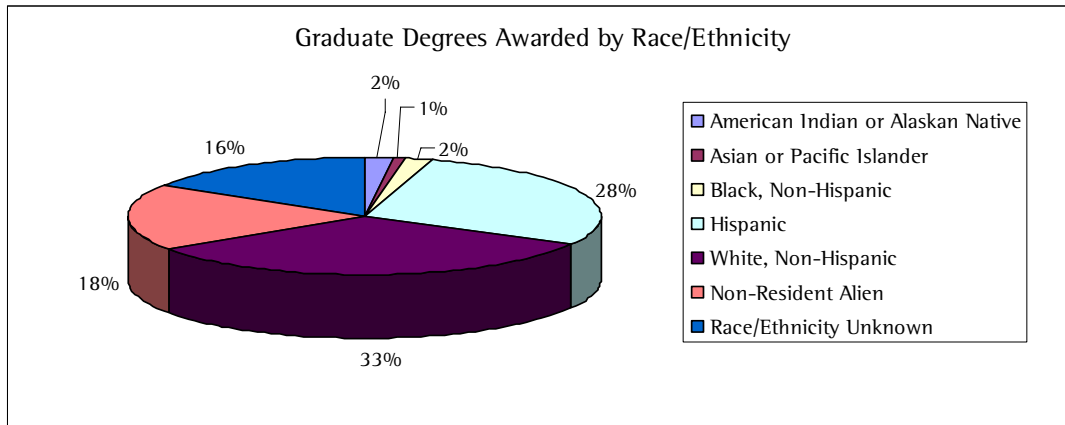

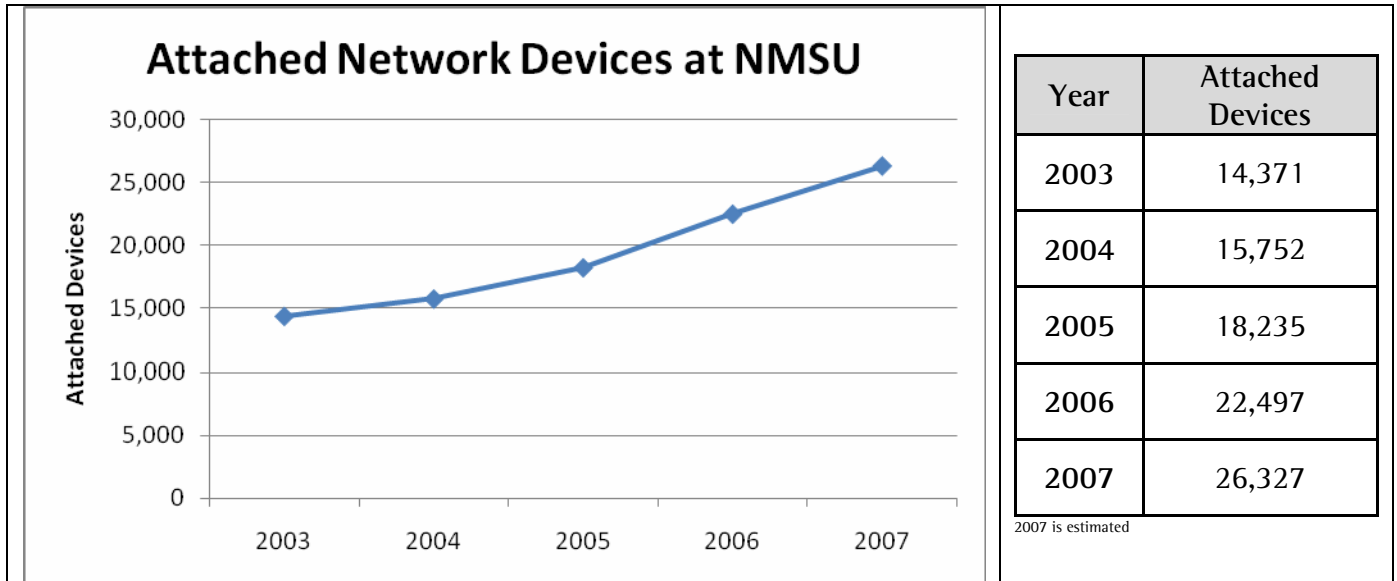

Campus-Wide Student Technology Fee

Information and Communication Technologies (ICT) provides account oversight, coordination and reporting for \$1.16M in funding provided by NMSU students through a direct student technology fee. Services that receive funds from this fee include student computer lab operations, wireless zones, multi-media/computer classrooms, help desk services, dial-up modem services, WebCT, web-based e-services, student portal, software licensing for students, increased security services, and core high-speed networking. Budget allocation and project prioritization is provided through a student committee, the Student Technology Advisory Committee (STAC). This committee and a full time professional staff member are responsible for ensuring that the funds are expended for appropriate projects or services, and that proper reporting ensues.

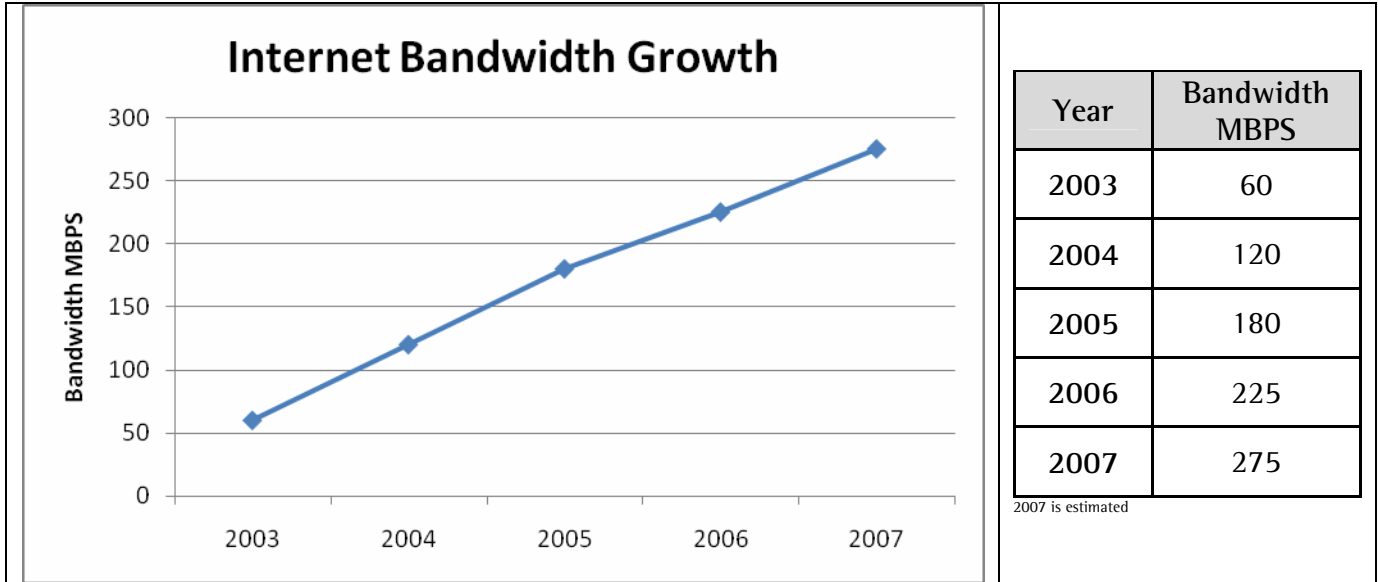
Computer Network Growth at NMSU

NMSU relies heavily on the network for much of its day-to-day business activities. Therefore, it is critical to determine the number of connected devices and the network utilization used by the university community. It is important to note that the connected devices include computers, printers, building managers and many other network attached devices. The chart below illustrates the rate of growth of the NMSU network. This service is part of ICT's outcome assessment process.



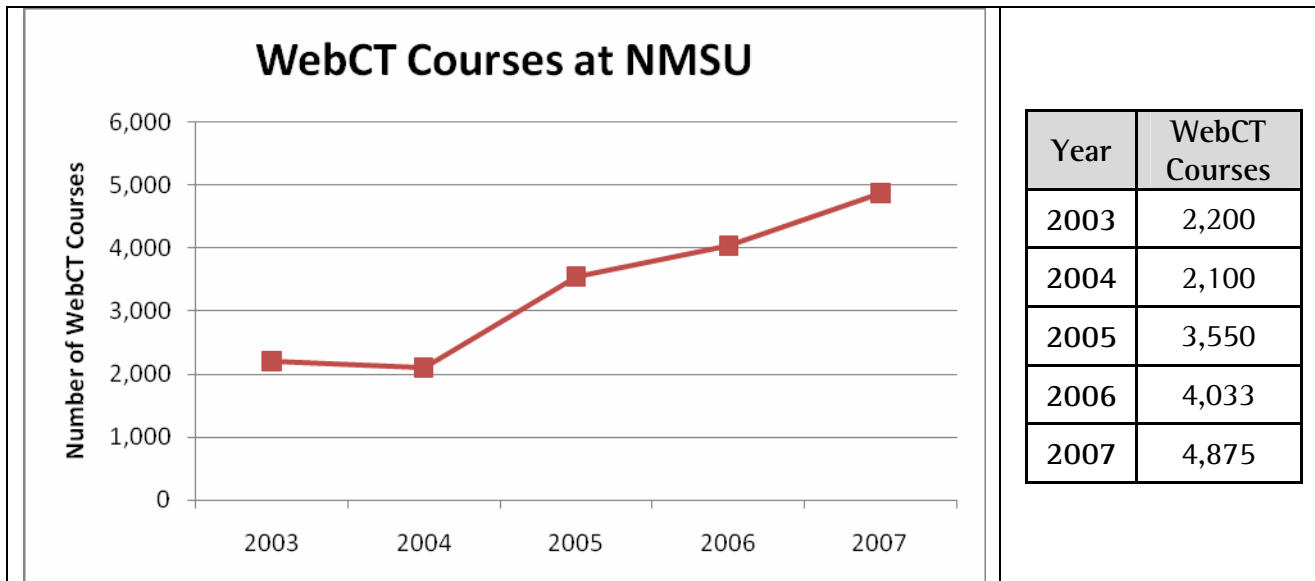

WebCT Courses at NMSU

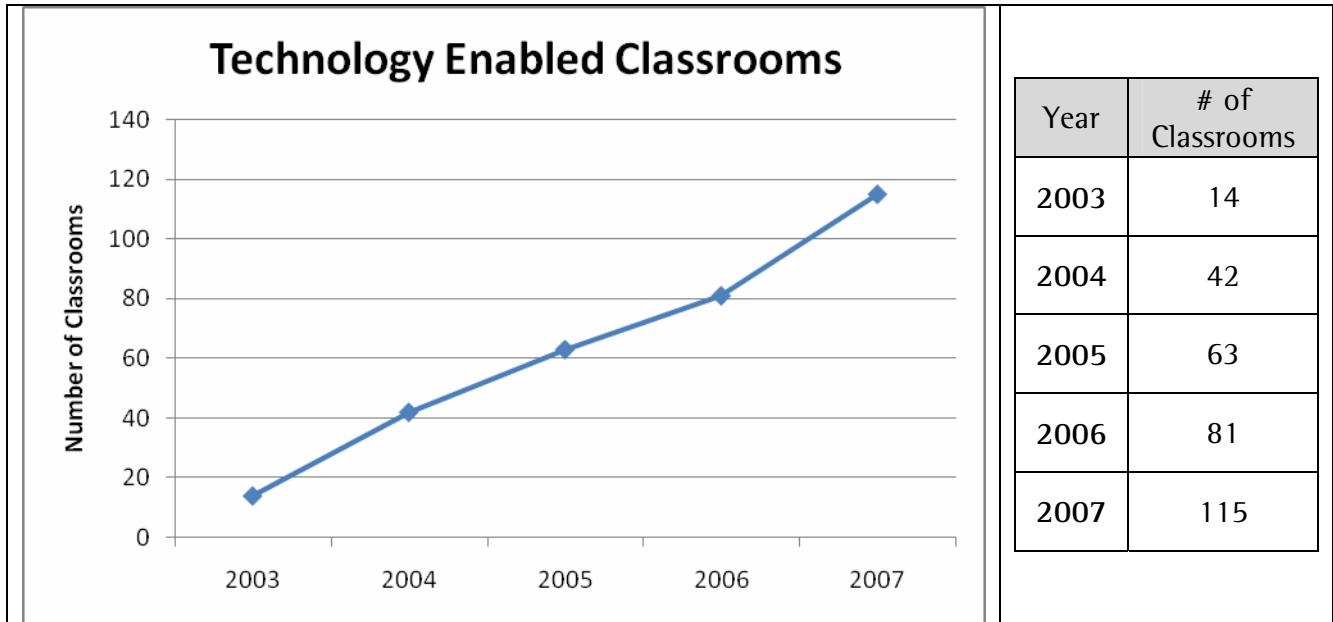
The demand for use of the NMSU Learning Management System (WebCT) continues to grow, as can be seen in the table below.

Technology Enabled Classrooms

ICT is responsible for providing classroom technology services and has developed a standard for classroom technology that has been very well accepted by the NMSU faculty. In order to maximize the available funding, ICT has developed a cost sharing program with the colleges. In FY05/06, this resulted in a cost share from the colleges of over \$211,000, or a ratio of 2.8. This effort has resulted in a steady increase of technology enabled classrooms as illustrated in the graph below.
